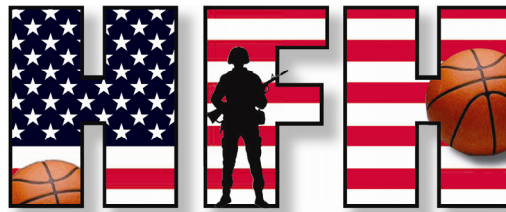

The Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund is pleased to announce that Dave Cummings of Epsom, NH, will spearhead a fundraising initiative, "Hoops for Heroes." This effort is intended to benefit IFHF through pledges supporting his lofty goal of single-handedly making one million foul shots, beginning on Veterans Day 2009, in support of the men and women who sacrifice for our nation. Mr. Cummings is not directly affiliated with the Fund but has represented to us that the proceeds from his efforts will be donated to the Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund.

A national leader in supporting those serving in our Armed Forces, the Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund is building The National Intrepid Center of Excellence. Set to open in 2010, this \$60 million, state-of-the art facility will be dedicated to research, diagnosis and treatment of traumatic brain injury, which has sadly become all too common, afflicting hundreds of thousands of returning troops.

The Fund accepts donations from any individual or organization that wishes to donate but does not oversee or otherwise control the fundraising activities of organizations that raise funds to donate to the Fund and will not audit the fundraising from this event. The Fund will provide written acknowledgement to Mr. Cummings upon receiving any and all donated funds.

100% of contributions to the Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund go to support military families; no administrative costs are deducted. The Fund's Board of Trustees underwrites all administrative costs. All contributions to the Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund are tax deductible to the fullest extent of the law. The Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund is a non profit organization. The Fund is a public charity exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
